KEYNOTE: Rabbi Dr. Tzvi Hersh Weinreb

A noted Rav, psychologist, and orator, Dr. Weinreb received his rabbinic ordination from the Rabbi Jacob Joseph School, a Masters degree in psychology from the New School for Social Research, and a Ph.D. from the University of Maryland. Dr. Weinreb served as assistant supervisor of psychological services for the Prince George's County Public Schools, chief psychologist of the Potomac Foundation for Mental Health, and maintained a private practice in psychotherapy. Rabbi Dr. Weinreb is the newly appointed Executive Vice President of the Orthodox Union and was formerly the spiritual leader of Congregation Shomrei Emenah of Baltimore, Maryland.

Dr. Aviva Biberfeld, Ph.D.

Dr. Aviva Biberfeld received a doctorate in clinical psychology from Yeshiva University, Ferkauf Graduate School of Psychology. She was a senior staff member at Maimonides Development Center and currently maintains a full time private practice in Brooklyn, New York. Dr. Biberfeld treats children, adolescents, and adults with a sub-specialty in parental counseling.

Norman Blumenthal, Ph.D.

Dr. Norman Blumenthal is a clinical psychologist in private practice in Hewlett, NY, specializing in adolescent and group therapy. Dr. Blumenthal is the coordinator of group psychotherapy training for psychiatric residents and psychology interns at Long Island Jewish Medical Center. He received his MA and Ph.D from Adelphi University.

Susan Buchweitz, C.S.W.

Susan Buchweitz is the Clinical Director of the Birchwood School, a special education school in the Clarkstown School District. Mrs. Buchweitz received her Masters in Social Work from Columbia University, and Post Masters from Hunter College and SUNY at New Paltz in Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy and School Administration. She maintains a private practice in New City, NY, specializing in children, teenagers, and family issues. Mrs. Buchweitz has published many articles, and has presented at conferences throughout the country.

Norman Fried, Ph.D.

Dr. Fried received his doctorate in psychology from Emory University and was a Fellow in Pediatric Psychology at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Fried is in private practice in Manhasset, New York specializing in adolescent and child psychotherapy, interpersonal communication, and parent and child conflicts.

Peter Goldenthal, Ph.D., ABPP

Dr. Peter Goldenthal is Clinical Assistant Professor of Psychiatry and Human Behavior, Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia. He has spent two decades as a practicing family psychologist. The acclaimed author of *Beyond Sibling Rivalry*, Dr. Goldenthal has been featured on *The Today Show* and frequently presents workshops on family relationship issues.

Rona Novick, Ph.D.

Dr. Novick is Senior Psychologist in the division of Adolescent Psychiatry at the North Shore-Long Island Jewish Health System, and is a member of the faculty of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. She is also in private practice on Long Island.

David Pelcovitz, Ph.D.

Dr. Pelcovitz is the Chief Child and Adolescent Psychologist at North Shore University Hospital/ NYU School of Medicine and clinical professor of psychology at NYU School of Medicine. He also teaches pastoral psychology courses for the Semicha program at Yeshiva University.

Gila Zelinger, C.S.W.

Gila Zelinger is a clinical social worker on the child and adolescent unit at the Robert Yeager Mental Health Clinic in Pomona, New York. She has conducted extensive parenting workshops in the Monsey community focusing on strengthening the Jewish family. Mrs. Zelinger is the chapter president of NEFESH, the International Association of Orthodox Mental Health Professionals, for Rockland and Northern New Jersey. She also maintains a private practice in Wesley Hills, New York.

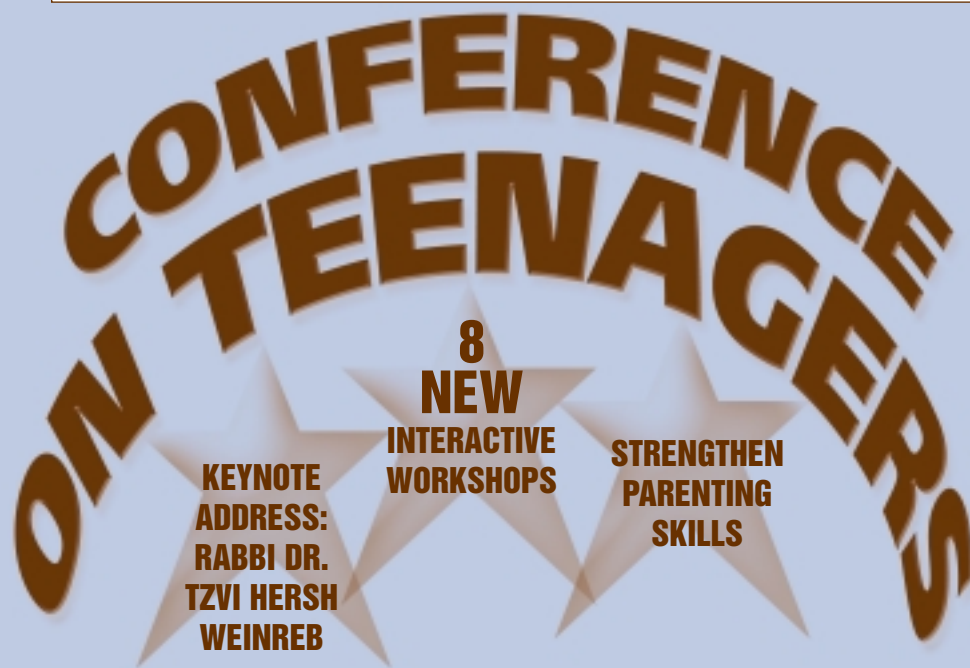
