Haftarah Helper 5781: Simchat Torah/V'zot Haberachah

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Joshua 1:1-18

The Haftarah picks up immediately after Moses's death in today's Torah reading. Joshua takes the reins of leadership with multiple tasks before him, including crossing the Jordan River and conquering the land of Canaan. He must also ensure that the two and a half tribes whom Moshe permitted to settle the East Bank of the Jordan keep their promise to first conquer the land, as recounted in Numbers, chapter 32. In these endeavors, God gives Joshua His support, as do the people, and commands him to be "strong and resolute."

Haftarah Breakdown

Verses 1-6: God promises Joshua that his leadership will be as strong as Moses's, especially in the conquest of the Land.

Joshua 1:5	יהושע א:ה

Verses 7-9: To succeed in his missions, Joshua must continuously study the Torah and observe it completely.

Joshua 1:8	יהושע א:ח
This book of the Torah shall not leave your mouth; you shall meditate therein day and night in order for you to carefully do all that is written in it. Verses 10-11: Joshua commands the people to prepare to cross the Jordan.

Verses 12-15: Joshua reminds the two and a half tribes to keep their promise to Moses.

Haftarah Breakdown (cont.)

Verses 16-18: The tribes commit to fulfilling their promise, and to fully serve Joshua.

Joshua 1:16	יהושע א:ט״ז

Parashah Connections

Among all Haftarot of the year, this Haftarah features the most explicit connection to its Torah reading. The conclusion of the Torah reading...

Deuteronomy 34:5	דברים ל״ד:ה

... leads directly into the Haftarah opening verse:

Other Connections

The requirement of daily Torah study is derived from the Haftarah across halachic literature, including here:

Kitzur Shulchan Arukh 27:2	קיצור שלחן ערוך כ״ז:ב
Every Jew must study the Torah, no matter whether he is poor or rich, whether he is healthy or suffering pain, whether he is young or very old. Even a beggar who goes from door to door must set aside a certain time for Torah study during the day and night, as [Joshua 1:8] is written: "You shall meditate therein day and night."	כָּל אִישׁ יִשְׂרָאֵל חַיָּב לִלְמֹד תּוֹרָה, בֵּין עָנִי בֵּין עָשִׁיר, בֵּין שָׁלֵם בְּגוּפּוֹ בֵּין בַּעַל יִסּוּרִין, בֵּין בָּחוּר בֵּין זָקֵן גָּדוֹל. אֲפָלוּ עָנִי הַמַּחְזִיר עַל הַפְּתָחִים, חַיָּב לִקְבֹּעַ לוֹ זְמַן לְתַלְמוּד תּוֹרָה בַּיּוֹם וּבַלַיִּלָה, שָׁנָּאֱמֵר וְהָגִיתָ בּוֹ יוֹמָם וָלַיִּלָה.

God's grant of absolute power to Joshua is accorded to every Jewish king over his subjects.

Mishneh Torah, Kings and Wars 3:8	משנה תורה, הלכות מלכים ומלחמות ג:ח
A king may execute anyone who rebels against him. Even if the king decreed that someone must go to a particular place but he did not go there; or, that he may not leave his house, but he left - [such a rebel] is liable to the death penalty. If [the king] wishes, he must be executed, as [Joshua 1:18] states, "Any man who rebels against [commands issued by] your mouth [shall be put to death.]"	כָּל הַמּוֹבֵד בְּמֶלֶךְ יִשְׂרָאֵל יֵשׁ לַמֶּלֶךְ רְשׁוּת לְהָרְגוֹ. אֲפִלּוּ גָּזַר עַל אֶחָד מִשְּׁאָר הָעָם שָׁיֵלֵךְ לְמָקוֹם פְּלוֹנִי וְלֹא הָלַךְ אוֹ שָׁלֹא יָצָא מִבֵּיתוֹ וְיָצָא חַיָּב מִיתָה. וְאִם רָצָה לְהָרְגוֹ יֵהָרֵג. שָׁנֶּאֱמַר (יהושע א יח) "כָּל אִישׁ אֲשֶׁר יַמְרֶה אֶת פִּירָ".
